Whether it was a one-time payment, a gift in exchange for a holiday tie, an ongoing paycheck deduction, or a regularly scheduled donation, YOUR GENEROSITY GOES TO GOOD CAUSES!

The DPCF is a 20-plus-year-old legal nonprofit charity. Established and run by the pilots of Delta Air Lines, the fund takes donations from Delta line pilots and distributes them to children's charities.

The DPCF splits normal donations into two buckets: restricted and unrestricted. The unrestricted monies are given out as grants two to three times a year as its funding level allows. Typical grants are \$1,000 to \$5,000.

Restricted funds can grow until a major project (\$80,000 to \$100,000) can be afforded. Our charter guides all grants, which dictates that the proceeds must be given to children's charities with priorities to pilot-base and pilot-centric geographies. We especially give weight to charities with some current Delta pilot connections. Delta pilots can donate in various ways: one-time donations by check or through the website portal, recurring donations via paycheck deductions, or automatic bank payments.

Last year was a great one for the fund. For regular donations and grants, we collected over \$75,000 and granted over \$42,000 in 2023. This has allowed our restricted fund to grow to over \$65,000 as we contemplate a major project. In the past, major projects have included additions to hospitals, ambulances, etc.

On a specific effort, we partnered with the Mary Bridge Foundation in our 2022–2023 holiday neckwear campaign to raise over \$10,000 for their Children's Hospital in Tacoma, Wash.

Our 2023–2024 holiday neckwear effort will enjoy a new partner in Gillette Children's Hospital. In a banner year, we have already sent a \$40,000 check to the hospital! Thanks to all Delta pilots who took part, wore the ties/scarves, and donated.

It's for the kids!

The DPCF is guided by a board of line pilots who volunteer their time to sort through the multitude of grant requests we receive to vet, analyze, and prioritize the worthiest.
